Engagement Readiness Self-Assessment Tool

Step-by-step guide



1. PREPARATION

1.1. Commit to the self-assessment process in your Higher Education Institution

Take the decision to complete the self-assessment and to follow the customized roadmap emerging from it. You will need to dedicate resources to the process.

1.2. Gather a group, which will represent the evaluated institution (or unit) in the self-assessment

This group should be aware of the structure and current situation of the HEI and agile enough to gather up for a discussion / workshop.

In the best case, the group would consist of the following professionals:

- University senior management and leadership who drive and develop institution-wide vision, mission and strategy for external engagement and collaboration (Rectorate, Vice-Rectorate for Engagement, Corporate Relations/Innovation, Senior Management of TTO/KTO and engagement departments, etc.)
- University professional (non-academic staff) and academic staff who practically implement and support/facilitate university-wide external engagement and collaboration vision, mission and vision
- (optional) Selected university academic staff from various faculties and departments who are at the forefront of engagement practices.

1.3. Organize a workshop / discussion

Completing the survey will take at least two hours, but depending on the depth of the conversation, probably even more. You can decide to organize multiple sessions, in each of which you complete and save parts of the survey.

Reserve a room or workspace where participants could discuss in a free manner and document the observations conveniently. To access and complete the self-assessment, you will need an Internet connection.

2. IMPLEMENTATION

The Engagement Readiness Self-Assessment Tool is a survey developed in accordance with the [Engagement Readiness Self-Assessment Framework](#) and technically implemented in [Webropol](#).

2.1. Get organized

Decide on the rules of the discussion / workshop, i.e., when is one allowed to talk, when a decision is reached, etc.

Choose members of the group, who will:

- lead the conversation
- keep track of time
- fill in the answers in the online survey on behalf of the group
- document the observations on behalf of the group

2.2. Read the instructions on the website

2.3. Open the Self-Assessment Tool and a documentation tool

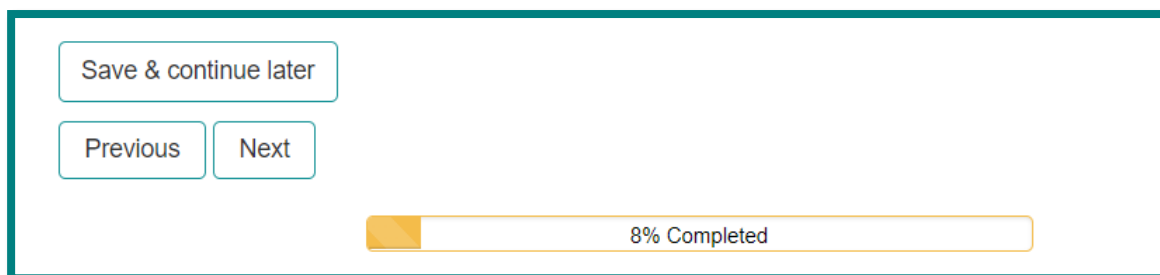

For the documentation of the self-assessment process, you can also choose another documentation tool, for example simply a text editor application (such as Microsoft Word) or a form / template of your Higher Education Institution.

2.4. Start filling the survey

Note that on the bottom of each page of the survey you will find a progress bar, navigation buttons, as well as a possibility to end the current session and save the survey for later completion.



To undertake the survey, first you need to agree to the practice of data collection.

2.5. Proceed with filling the survey by alternating between the question and recommendation phases

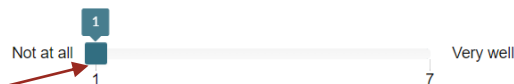
Question phase:

Information about the dimension being assessed

This dimension refers to an institution's staff awareness and knowledge with regards to the current state of external engagement activities, resources and support available at the institution, drivers and barriers affecting external engagement.

Note that you need to move the slide switch to activate it, even if your chosen value is 1. Its color then changes from grey to green.
